after the stay in the country of departure exceeding 12 hours and subsequent stay in the Czechia exceeding 12 hours
 (or 24 hours in case of travelling to/from the neighbouring countries)

There are exceptions from these rules, particularly for the international transport and regular cross-border movement.

¹ persons who have been vaccinated against Covid-19 **in the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Germany, Austria, Poland, Hungary, Slovenia and Croatia** do not have the obligation to undergo test and do not have the limitation of the free movement after the arrival, while travelling from **the EU+ countries with medium and high risk**

² it is not possible to travel to these countries at the moment

³ citizens of Czechia and their family members with a residence permit, EU+ citizens with a certificate of temporary residence and foreigners with a permanent residence permit **who use an individual transportation for their travel to Czechia, may replace required test before the departure with an antigen or a PCR test undergone within 5 days after the arrival**

⁴ this does not apply to the citizens of Czechia and their family members with a residence permit, EU+ citizens with a certificate of temporary residence and foreigners with a permanent residence permit **who use an individual transportation for their travel to Czechia**

⁵ citizens of Czechia and their family members with a residence permit, EU+ citizens with a certificate of temporary residence and foreigners with a permanent residence permit **may have antigen test not older than 24 hours instead of PCR test**
